Simonside Primary School and New Secondary School Proposals





What Are The Proposals?

Due to significant growth in demand for secondary school places across the city it is proposed to establish a new secondary school on the Simonside site, alongside Simonside Primary School.



Will the new secondary school be a Free School?

Current legislation states that all new schools must be Free Schools and become an academy on opening.

Who would run the new secondary school?

The Council has been exploring options for an existing successful Academy Trust to bid to the Department for Education to establish a new secondary school in the Outer West area. Gosforth Federated Academies Trust have agreed to submit a bid. They are seeking expressions of interest and preparing a bid for the next wave of free school applications.

Sports provision & community access

Sports provision is identified within the proposals to meet the needs of the schools and provide for community use.

Will there be post-16 provision?

Post-16 provision is not proposed on this site as there is already a wide range of existing post-16 provision in the area as well as across Newcastle and neighbouring areas.



What secondary school provision is proposed?

A secondary school for 1,050 pupils aged 11-16 years (Year 7 to Year 11) is proposed. The size of the school is based on the forecasts of places that will be needed, based on children currently travelling through the primary system and additional numbers projected from planned housing developments.

What are the proposals for Simonside Primary School?

There will also be growing demand for primary school places resulting from planned housing developments.

For this reason, the Council has been working closely with the governors of Simonside Primary School, who are part of the Outer



West Learning Trust (OWLT), to explore proposals for new or upgraded facilities, and an increase in capacity from 315 to 420 places for pupils aged 4-11 years. Other primary school expansions and new provision also form part of future planning. Simonside will continue to be part of the OWLT.
